

## November General Election November 3, 2009

### Amendments Election:

- HJR 7\_\_Authorizing the state to contribute money, property and other resources for the establishment, maintenance, and operation of veterans hospitals in this state
- HJR 14-1\_\_Prohibit the taking, damaging or destroying of private property for public use unless the action is for the ownership, use and enjoyment of the property by the State, a political subdivision of the State, the public at large, or entities granted the power of eminent domain under law or for the elimination of urban blight on a particular parcel of property, but not for certain economic development or enhancement of tax revenue purposes and to limit the legislature's authority to grant the power of eminent domain to an entity.
- HJR 14-2\_\_Establishing the national research university fund, to enable emerging research universities in this state to achieve national prominence as major research universities and transferring the balance of the higher education fund to the national research university fund.
- HJR 36-1\_\_Authorizing the legislature to provide for the ad valorem taxation of a residence homestead solely on the basis of the property's value as residence homestead
- HJR 36-2\_\_Authorizing the legislature to authorize a single board of equalization for two or more adjoining appraisal entities that elect to provide for consolidated equalizations
- HJR 36-3\_\_Providing for uniform standards and procedures for the appraisal of property for ad valorem tax purposes
- HJR 85\_\_Provide that elected members of the governing boards of emergency services districts may serve terms not to exceed four years
- HJR 102\_\_Protect the right of the public, individually and collectively to access and use the public beaches bordering the seaward shore of the Gulf of Mexico
- HJR 116\_\_Authorizing the Veterans' Land Board to issue general obligation bonds in amounts equal to or less than amounts previously authorized
- HJR 127\_\_Allow an officer or enlisted member of the Texas State Guard or other state militia or military force to hold other civil offices

- HJR 132\_\_Authorizing the financing, including through tax increment financing, of the acquisition by municipalities and counties to buffer areas or open spaces adjacent to a military installation for the prevention of encroachment or for the construction of roadways, utilities or other infrastructure to protect or promote the mission of the military installation.
