Shelly Butts, Emergency Management Coordinator gave an update on numbers for the radio system and other projects they have been waiting on from Brazos Valley Wide Area Communication System. She told commissioners they are not being asked to vote on anything today, this is for information only referring to the handouts she had provided and included in these minutes. She discussed several of the grant funding projects such as cleaning up the tower and getting ready for the antennas provided by DPS project and getting Sheriff's office ready for the new CAD and dispatch console station. The county is saving money by partnering with DPS. Projected cost for 2020 is \$173,288.76 and 2021, \$119,590.49 a considerable reduction from five million when this project began several of years ago, she said.

ITEM 22. Discuss and consider resolution to approve Madison County Tax Assessor/Collector to calculate the voter-approval tax rate of the County in the manner provided for a special taxing unit (at a voter-approval rate of 8%) due to the declarations of disaster by the Governor of Texas and the President of the United States. See attached.

Judge Leago said I can tell you this is not an 8% tax increase and it is not asking for an 8% tax increase. Karen Lane, TAC said this asking for the court to allow me to calculate what was the effective tax rate, rollback rate which is now the no new tax rate and voter approved tax rate. In the past we have had an 8% difference between the two rates, but Senate Bill 2 changed it to a 3.5%. Since we are under a disaster declaration, we have the option of calculating at the 8%. It does not mean you go up 8% you have the option of doing it because of the disaster. It gives the option in the next two years to also do the 8% if our values do not exceed this year's values. So, you have leeway on the amount you can go up in the tax rate without having an election. Commissioner Cannon asked if it raises the limit, yes it raises the limit, Lane said. This gives us an 8% gap and without approval will give us the 3.5% gap. Commissioner Driskell moved to approve resolution for Madison County Tax Assessor/Collector to calculate the voter-approval tax rate of the County in the manner provided for a special taxing unit (at a voter-approval rate of 8%) due to the declarations of disaster by the Governor of Texas and the President of the United States; Commissioner Cannon gave a second; and Judge called for a vote. ITEM 23. Discuss and consider for approval contract with Linebarger Goggan Blair and Sampson, LLP for the collection of delinquent taxes. See attached.

Wade Gent, Attorney, Linebarger Goggan Blair and Sampson LLP said Agenda Items 23, 24, and 25 are all related. This is a two-step resolution for our law firm to collect early some delinquent property taxes. Property taxes are divided basically between two different categories, real estate and personal properties that are used by a business in their operations, inventories, and equipment. Typically, we are not allowed to begin collecting delinquent taxes until July 1<sup>st</sup>, the following year after they become delinquent. This resolution allows us to begin three months earlier, April 1<sup>st</sup> for only the business personal property. There are multiple benefits to doing this, particularly now because, several of businesses are closing and leaving the county. It allows us to try and identify those before they take their property and leave the county and hopefully be able to recover that loss tax revenue when a business is in danger of going out of business and moving the taxable property from the county. Commissioner Cannon moved for approval a contract with Linebarger Goggan Blair and Sampson, LLP for the collection of delinquent taxes; Commissioner Driskell gave a second; and Judge called for a vote. ITEM 25. Discuss and consider for approval Order Authorizing Early Additional Penalty on Delinquent Personal Property Taxes under Tex. Tax Code § 33.11 to defray costs of collection. See attached. Wade Gent, Attorney, Linebarger Goggan Blair and Sampson LLP said this is the Order needed from the Commissioner Court that when we do collect those accounts early, this is where the additional penalty to delinquent tax payers attaches in April instead of July. Commissioner Cannon asked, so if someone leaves the county owing taxes do we have a recourse to collect what is owed? Gent said if property leaves the county we have two options, one is to pursue personal judgment against the company or the individual who had the property or if property is in another county in the state we may be able to seize it, there are several steps to make that happen, he said. The easiest way to ensure payment is to go out with the Sheriff with a tax warrant and tell them to pay or we will lock the doors. This Order allows us to collect those taxes.

ITEM 30. Discuss and consider Resolution of Madison County Authorizing Professional Service Provider Selection for Community Development Block Grant-Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) Programs through the Texas General Land Office (GLO). See attached.

Shelly Butts, Emergency Management Coordinator said this is the Grant we approved last week, but we do not know what our projects are at this time, this Grant is for three million dollars. It has a little less stringent requirements than grants in the past, so we are looking forward to getting this going. Judge said this Grant requires a three million-dollar minimum project and we can go up to five or seven million. Judge said we need to get this going so we can identify projects that fall into the perimeters so we can submit our application. Commissioner Cannon asked if this is something that is not going to be solely for roads and can be county-wide. Judge answered, yes sir. Commissioner Driskell said so this is different from other grants we have had. Judge said there are three other grants in the mix now, but this is a mitigation grant, the perimeters are must wider. It does not have to be attached to a previous disaster; it is looking forward not backwards. Judge called on Coy Richards, Grant Works who said most of these projects are going to be related to drainage and that could be anything including culverts. Your priorities should be what you think might happen, what future problems could you solve by improving your infrastructure and that is what the money is for. Mostly the ones we have seen so far are going to be drainage problems, a lot of blade and culvert work that sort of thing. Commissioner Cannon said so this is a preventative type grant. Richards said yes. The only reason Madison County is eligible for the funds is for the past declared disasters here. Judge said this is one you need to think outside the box because you may have opportunities with this grant that you may have thought you would never have as far as fixing up something that is not technically broke. Richards said there can be work on drainage problems in the City of Madisonville too, because it is a county grant. You can work on anything in the county if it is in your mitigation plan. Commissioner Cannon asked about our county jail, Judge said there is a drainage problem there.

Commissioner Driskell made a motion to approve Resolution and accept Grant Works to provide application and planning services for CDBG-MIT program(s); Commissioner Cannon seconded the motion; and Judge Leago called for a vote.
